CITY OF GRAHAM FUNDS DOWNTOWN FAÇADE GRANT PROGRAM



The City of Graham spent \$10,000 on our Local Historic District this year, spurring an additional \$39,080 in private capital to upgrade our downtown façades. Our biggest project was the Graham Cinema, which received \$3,595 of public funds to help assist with the \$25,405 in renovations. Every dollar of public money was coupled with three dollars of private investment! Since the program was started in 2004, the City has paid \$74,582, with \$170,475 spent on façade improvements. FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Graham is ready to begin fall and winter leaf collection. Crews will begin on Monday, October 26, 2015 thru Friday, January 29, 2016. Residents are encouraged to use this "loose leaf" collection service because of landfill disposal regulations. During this time call-in service will not be available. Residents should pile loose leaves behind curb or on the shoulder of streets without curb and gutter by 8:00 a.m. to ensure collection. Leaves should not be piled in the street, drainage ditches, or over water meters. Leaves containing gravel, glass, or other solid matter will not be collected. Should more frequent leaf collection be needed, residents are required to place leaves in suitable containers and set them out with their regular yard waste. Bagged leaves will not be **collected.** Please direct questions to the Sanitation Division at 570-6709 or 570-6710.

NO CONTINUOUS DOG TETHERING


According to a revision regarding animal cruelty in the City's Code of Ordinances, effective January 1, 2016 it shall be unlawful to leave your dog tethered to a stationary object for a period of more than two hours. During periods of lawful tethering, those periods less than two hours, the length of the tether must be 10 feet in length and cannot weigh more than 10 percent of the dog's body weight. No person shall tether in a manner that restricts the dog's access to adequate food, water, and shelter. Violations can

result in penalties up to \$500 and seizure of the animal. Please contact the Graham Police Department at 570-6711 for more information.



FOG

Below is a list of things residents should do to keep FOG (Fats, Oils, & Grease) out of your household plumbing and the city's sewer system. Never pour Fats, Oils, and Grease down the sink drain or toilet. Place Fats, Oils, Grease, and Food Scraps into a container and after cooling, dispose of them in your garbage. Do not put food scraps down the garbage disposal as this only shreds them into smaller pieces and does not prevent grease from going down the drain.


Use a strainer in your sink to catch food scraps. Please follow these recommendations to help insure that your drain pipes will remain "FAT FREE".

Home Electronics Banned from Pickup

As of July 1, 2012, Alamance County banned home electronics from its landfill. The City of Graham Sanitation Department is not responsible for the collection of these items during the weekly curbside pickup. Residents can dispose of these items at the Alamance County Landfill or an e-waste recycling site. Among the prohibited items are: Televisions, VCRs, Stereos, tape players, radios, fax machines, DVD players, CD players, telephones and rechargeable batteries. Also personal computers, desktops, servers, laptops, docking stations, automated typewriters, copy machines are prohibited. As reflected in our Mission Statement, the Graham Police Department strives to partner with the community in our efforts to "provide a safe environment and enhance the quality of life through courteous, honest and professional deliver of law enforcement services." One of the ways we accomplish this mission is through our commitment to upholding the standards set by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc.

(CALEA). We have been accredited by CALEA since 1998. This December, we will have our on-site assessment. PLAY A ROLE IN PREVENTING FALLS AND ENCOURAGE THE OLDER ADULTS IN YOUR LIFE TO DO THE FOLLOWING:

Get some exercise. Lack of exercise can lead to weak legs and this increases the chances of falling. Exercise programs such as Tai Chi can increase strength and improve balance, making falls much less likely.

Be mindful of medications. Some medicines or combinations of medicines can have side effects such as dizziness or drowsiness. This can make falling more likely. Having a doctor or pharmacist review all medications can help reduce the chance of risky side effects from drug interactions.

Keep their vision sharp. Poor vision can make it harder to get around safely. Older adults should have their eyes checked every year and wear glasses or contact lenses with the right prescription strength to ensure that they are seeing clearly.

Eliminate hazards at home. About half of all falls happen at home. A home safety check can help identify potential fall hazards that need to be removed or changed, such as tripping hazards, clutter, and poor lighting.
