In the last year, the City of Graham received a number of grants, totaling more than \$2.2 million!



As the residents of Graham requested, we've been focusing on our Downtown. Graham received three grants in an attempt to help speed our recovery. The first grant studies an installation of a bike lane on Pine Street and more prominent crosswalks at our schools and parks, which should cost just under the granted \$60,000. Graham also received two planning grants, one for \$75,000 (Local Foods, Local Places) which focuses on connecting farmers and restaurants. The second, which was awarded from the Creative Economic Development Consulting group is worth \$50,000 and will focus on creating a financing structure for property owners in our downtown. The City also received another \$50,000 in funding from the Rural Economic Development Division, which will be allocated toward a revolving loan fund to invest in new businesses within our downtown!

Meanwhile, in an effort to keep our City beautiful and forward our status as a Tree City USA, we've received a grant from the NC Forestry service which has allowed us to inventory the health, GPS location, and species of most of our street trees! This grant awarded the City about \$6,500. Graham also received a \$10,000 grant from Duke Energy to install two electric car chargers on East Elm Street.

The Graham Recreation and Parks Department has been knocking it out of the park with an award of \$500,000 for an inclusive playground at the new Graham Regional Park.

Golden Leaf and the Rural Center for Economic Development awarded \$750,000 for roadway construction at the North Carolina Commerce Park. This roadway extension allowed new development, including the Lidl project, to keep truck traffic off residential roadways.

The City was awarded \$612,500 in grant funds and \$1,837,500 in 0% interest loan funds by the State Water Infrastructure Authority for the replacement of the Boyd **Creek Pump Station.**

The Graham Police Department received an award of \$110,921 from the Governor's Highway Safety Program to support highway safety personnel.

We're very excited about being able to leverage these funds to improve the quality of life for our residents.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

The City of Graham is ready to begin their fall and winter leaf collection. Collection crews will begin on Monday, October 30, 2017 thru Friday, February 2, 2018. Residents are encouraged to use "loose leaf" collection service due to landfill disposal regulations. During this time, call-in service will not be available. Residents should pile loose leaves behind the curb or on the shoulder of streets without curb and gutter by 8:00 a.m. to ensure collection. Leaves should not be piled in the street, drainage ditches, or over water meters. Leaves

which contain gravel, glass, or other solid matter will not be collected. Should more frequent leaf collection be desired, residents are required to place leaves in suitable containers and set them out with their regular yard waste. The City will not pick



up leaves placed in bags at any time! Questions concerning leaf collection should be directed to the Sanitation Department at 570-6709. Please do not call requesting special pick-up. Crews are working set areas, on a set schedule and cannot accommodate special pick-ups. Thank you for your cooperation!

Water Bill Payment Options

The City of Graham has several self-service and auto pay options for your convenience. Payments may be made 24-hours a day utilizing our online and automated phone service. The City also partners with most financial institutions for expedited processing of "online bill pay" services offered by banks.

Fire Prevention Week

In a fire, every second counts. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy.

That's why this year's Fire Prevention Week theme: "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" is so important. It reinforces why everyone needs to have an escape plan. Here's this year's key campaign messages:

<u>Draw a map of your home</u> (PDF) with all members of your household, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.

- Practice your home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in your home, and practice using different ways out.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.

• Make sure the number of your home is clearly marked and easy for the fire department to find.

• Close doors behind you as you leave – this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.

Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.

DON'T FLUSH TROUBLE!!! Did you know that baby wipes may indicate they are flushable, but they should not be flushed? This also includes adult wipes and cleaning wipes. In fact, the only paper product that should be 'flushed' is toilet paper. Toilet paper is the only paper designed to breakdown as it travels through the sewer lines and into the wastewater treatment process. All others were NOT designed to breakdown and thus may create problems within the sewer system. These wipes can cause blockages in your home's sewer lines that could lead to costly plumbing repairs. Please remember

use the trash can, not the toilet when disposing of wipes!
