- Business Beautification Grant
  - Each applicant was given an opportunity to explain their project. The commission asked the applicant questions. The commission took a brief recess after all presentations to score individual projects. Clark-Baldwin made the motion to recess, Hall seconded. After all applicants had been heard the commission prioritized each project score from highest to lowest priority and submitted their scores to staff for final prioritized list.

    - 604 Washington St, Janet Ecklebarger
    - 615 W. Harden St, Trialhead Church
    - 30 SW Court Square, Graham Furniture Mart
  - The commission determined the top 2 priority projects were 303 W. Harden and 604 Washington St.
  - 303 W Harden was awarded the full grant amount requested of \$4,904. Motion for approval made by Clark-Baldwin, seconded by Ray.
  - 604 Washington St. was awarded the full grant amount requested of \$3,8950.50. Motion for approval made by Ray, seconded by Clark-Baldwin.
  - 615 W Harden was not awarded any funds through the grant. Motion made by Clark-Baldwin, seconded by Hall.
  - 30 SW Court Square was tabled until the next AC meeting. Conflicts between Business
     Beautification Grant and Façade grant. Motion made by Whitaker, seconded by Clark-Baldwin.
  - The commission decided to extend the Business Beautification Grant until the month of December. New application deadline is December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021.

## City of Graham Residential Appearance Award Guidelines

### What is the Graham Residential Appearance Award?

The City of Graham Appearance Commission recognizes the hard work and pride exhibited by residents who beautify their yard and contribute to the aesthetic appeal of our community. This award is intended to inspire others in their yard and to improve the overall quality of life in Graham.

### What are the rules?

- Only residential properties, either owner-occupied or rented, are eligible
- The upkeep of the yard can reflect the efforts of the residents themselves or that of a professional landscaper
- Anyone may nominate a yard, whether they live in the City or outside the City, but the yard needs to be located within the City limits or ETJ
- The judges may also nominate yards
- Each yard is limited to winning the award only once in any two consecutive calendar years

### What are the evaluation criteria?

Graham Appearance Commission members will judge residences using the criteria in the Residential Appearance Award scoring matrix. After narrowing it down to three properties based on the highest score the Commission will discuss each choice to determine a winner. All judge's decisions are final.

### When will judges decide?

Each season Spring, Summer, Fall, and Winter a new home will be selected for the award. Award winners will be selected in May, July, September, and December.

### What happens if I win?

Winners are honored as follows:

- A Residential Appearance Award yard sign will be provided by the City to the award recipient for one month following the award, to be placed in the front of the house or in the side yard.
- A picture of the yard with the award recipient's permission will be placed on the City's Facebook page as well as a congratulations note on the City water bill. A press release will also be sent with a request for publication to local news outlets.

### How do I nominate a yard?

You may nominate your own yard or someone else's yard by filling out a Residential Appearance nomination form is available below, and can also be found on the City of Graham website at <a href="http://www.cityofgraham.com/city-hall/boards-and-commissions/appearance-commission/">http://www.cityofgraham.com/city-hall/boards-and-commissions/appearance-commission/</a> or it may be picked up at the Graham Municipal Building located at 201 South Main St., Graham, NC. Awards are given out for recognition during the following months:

- May (Nominations must be submitted by May 9)
- July (Nominations must be submitted by July 4)
- September (Nominations must be submitted by September 5)
- December For Holiday Yard Decorating (Nominations must be submitted by December
   5)
