

Fire Prevention safety tips:

- Make sure your home has working smoke alarms. You need a smoke alarm on every level, inside each sleeping room, and outside each separate sleeping area. Interconnect the alarms so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Test your alarms at least once a month. Press each test button to make sure it is working.
- Practice your fire drill. Plan your home escape. Share the plan with everyone in the family and guests.
- If there is a fire, get outside quickly and stay outside. Then call 9-1-1.

Water & Sewer

New water rate changes effective January 2021


The City of Graham's water and sewer service has a combined All customers billing structure. receiving Graham water and sewer services are to remit payment for usage by the 18th day of every month. On the 19th day, fees incurred as a result of nonpayment include a late fee of 2% of the total bill or a minimum of \$5, whichever is greater. The customer is then given until the 28th day of the month to remit payment. On the 29th day of the month, there is an additional \$40 fee added to your account for nonpayment. Interruption of service, meaning your water is turned off, will occur no earlier than the 29th day of the month. When service is discontinued for nonpayment, the account must be paid in full prior to reestablishing service. Additionally, it is unlawful to tamper with, cut on, or cut off any water service which has been discontinued for nonpayment.
