MINUTES

PRESENT: Chair Jay Cook, Brian Cutlip, Tim Beshel, Laurie Pickard, Nicki Smith STAFF: Brian Faucette

Chair Cook called the meeting to order at 6:36 with a welcome.

MINUTES

-Mr. Cutlip made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 13, 2021 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Smith and unanimously approved.

CHAIR'S REPORT - Chair Cook asked for clarification on the Lake fees. Mr. Faucette reported the fees have been simplified for staff and customers and the lake is now taking credit cards.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- -Mr. Faucette reported the Pumpkin Bash, Youth basketball and Ice Rink programs will operate as normal.
- -Mr. Faucette reported 10 full-time staff member and 3 part-time staff members have completed training with some of those hours fulfilling the Inclusion Policy requirements.
- -Mr. Faucette informed the Commission that Cooke Park Shelter #2 was completely destroyed by fire on 1/1/22.
- -Mr. Faucette reported all supervisors are beginning to evaluate their part-time staff using the same evaluation process used for fulltime city employees.

OLD BUSINESS

- -Mr. Faucette suggested the Community Listening Sessions begin on April 29th at the Arbor Day event. Details will be forwarded as they are finalized.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the department is still in need of part-time staff but some positions have been filled.

NEW BUSINESS

- -Mr. Faucette presented the latest plans from the Graham-Mebane Lake Site Master Plan and asked the Commission to review and provide feedback.
- -Mr. Faucette highlighted the recent crosswalk and sidewalk project completed at Graham Regional Park and the HVAC screen project to be completed at the 200 North Pocket Park later this spring.

-After a review of the CIP requests, Commission members asked about the possibility of purchasing adjacent land to existing parks. Mr. Faucette reported there is a line in the Capital Improvement Plan requesting money for a future purchase of adjacent property and the recently adopted GRPD Master Plan highlights the opportunity to purchase land adjacent to Cooke Park and Graham Regional Park. The current Graham-Mebane Lake Site Master Plan will highlight the opportunity to purchase adjacent land to lake. These plans would be used in grant applications for a land purchase or to reimburse the City for a purchase of such property. -Commission members discussed the various rules followed by the partners in the youth basketball program. Mr. Faucette will inform the Athletic Supervisor that different sites interpreted the substitution rule in various ways and the Commission recommends a uniform process be followed by all departments at all sites.

With all business concluded, Mr. Cutlip made a motion to adjourn at 7:34pm, seconded by Mrs. Pickard and unanimously approved.

Graham Recreation and Parks Commission Director's Report for March '22

I. COVID-19 - The GRPD will continue to monitor changing conditions and adjust program and facility plans as necessary but no restrictions are currently in place.

II. Present Projects

- a. Shelter #2 @ Cooke Park The Public Works Department has removed the debris from the shelter fire. Park Div. staff is planning for a new shelter and surrounding grounds.
- **b. Graham-Mebane Lake Master Plan** Steve Hadden had a Zoom meeting with the firm on Mar. 30th. A full update is expected in the next couple of months.
- c. 200 North pocket park No additional work has been completed.

III. Future Projects

- **a.** Multi-purpose Complex @ GRP AWCK is currently surveying a center line for the entry road which will allow Public Works to begin clearing and grading a road to the back of the property.
- **b. Dog Park additions** Staff continue to explore options. 1) Adding a new dog park at South Graham Park or 2) Adding amenities to the existing dog park at Cooke Park.
- c. Cabin at Cooke Park Plans to reimagine/renovate the cabin remain paused.

IV. Policies/Manuals

- a. Sponsorship Work on the development of a departmental sponsorship policy is progressing.
- **b. G/M Lake Operations Manual -** An operations manual draft was received at the end of March. Staff will review and edit the manual for the Lake Warden.
- V. Historical Museum Attendance 33 signed the guest book in March.

VI. Outside Committees

- a. Friends of GRPD no meeting in March.
- b. Wellness Collaborative I am still not able to attend the meetings.

VII. Staffing

- **a. Open positions** Multiple positions across the GRPD remain open. Supervisors are currently reviewing the few applications and interviewing qualified candidates. The department is still advertising the following part-time positions:
 - i. Lake Attendant
 - ii. Recreation Facility Maintenance Worker and Recreation Facility Attendant
 - iii. Day Camp Counselor, Day Camp Asst. Director and Day Camp Director
- **b. Filled positions** We have been able to fill the Parks-Athletic Facilities General Maintenance Worker position and the Athletic Facility Attendant position. Both positions were filled with two new staff members. We continue to interview additional candidates.

Facility Updates:



Recreation Center:

All lettering and numbers have been installed on the basketball goal backboards and remote tested with the corresponding number for the goals and height adjusters. The Alamance County Community Services has again postponed the return of the Congregate Meal Nutrition Program to a date to be determined. The Recreation Center will be an early voting site for the Federal and State Primary Elections April 28-May 14. A pre-safety inspection and some measurements were done by the Board of Elections on their site visits. Sawyer Exterminating conducted the quarterly treatment for pests. Jefferies Safety and Supply conducted the annual inspection of the fire extinguishers in the building. Tel fixed the "spinning chair" on the playground. The IT Department adjusted the desktop computer in the hallway to allow staff from the SABGC to record their hours worked daily. After an extensive effort by staff to troubleshoot a problem with the Viper Floor Machine, a certified technician was contacted from Preferred Service from Hight Point, NC. The culprit was finally found.....a piece of chewing gum.

Civic Center:

Jefferies Safety and Supply conducted the annual fire extinguisher inspection. Upon a routine maintenance visit, staff discovered no heat and only cold water in the building. Last Call HVAC was called in an attempt to determine the probable cause in the HVAC units. To our surprise they observed a pin lock installed on the outside gas controls. Unknown to us, Piedmont Gas had shut off the gas to do "repairs" and this information was found on a door insert that had blown into a bush. Several phone calls were made to Piedmont Gas who initially said that the gas had not been turned off and it was not locked. The problem was finally resolved after more phone calls and two work orders 5 days later.

Graham-Mebane Lake Report, March 2022 Graham Recreation and Parks Department



The Lake returned to its six-days-a-week schedule on March 1st. Public use of the lake dropped back to pre-pandemic levels; poor weekend weather and muddy water conditions may have played a role in that. The April and May numbers should tell us how much of the pandemic bump will stay with us.

Bass fishing was fair with five trophy-sized bass weighed-in. It appears the crappie were as close-mouthed as the crappie anglers, few catches were reported. Business was average, down 150 boats and 300 visitors from last year.

March Lake Highlights

- Steve attended the NCRPA's virtual Supervisor's Workshop on the 3rd.
- We held our Bass Tournament on the 26th. Thirty-six anglers in 19 boats came out to battle muddy water conditions and high winds, but they, and the Lake, did themselves proud. The three winning teams caught over 20 pounds of bass each, with the Big Fish of the day just over 7½ pounds. The Lake Staff did a great job running the event, the morning launch and afternoon weigh-in were smooth and efficient.
- Matt Davis, of Graham, won the month in our Big Bass Tournament with an 8.04-pound bass. We added 29 anglers to the Tournament, raising the total to 49. Twenty-five of those 29 entrants also chose to enter our Second Chance Tournament.
- We sold 46 Annual Permits, bringing this year's total to 83.
- The lake remained at full pool for the month.


