Facility Updates:

Recreation Center:

The beginning of January did not disappoint for the start of 2022 by introducing winter weather with snow, ice and cancellations and delays. Mastercraft returned and replaced the basketball goal backboard and height adjuster that had been damaged during a basketball practice. Due to a delay in shipment, installation of a new height adjuster motor was completed the following week. Basketball Goal numbers and Height Adjuster numbers were applied to the backboards to identify the goals for retraction and height adjustment by a remote control. The yearly fire alarm inspection was completed by Innovative Sound and Security with no issues. Met with the new Alamance County Community Services Nutrition Coordinator, Jasmine Woods, to access the possibility of the return of the Congregate Meal Program in March. Carolina All-in-One remounted one the stall door's frame to the concrete wall in the Ladies Restroom. All restroom stall doors were leveled and squared and reattached with the customary tamperproof bolts and screws.

Graham-Mebane Lake Report, January 2022

The lake is closed in January. We use this downtime to prepare for our opening in February and to continue planning our Spring and Summer events. On good weather days, it's maintenance and cleaning of buildings, equipment, and grounds; otherwise it's indoors and updating forms, rules, waiver sheets, etc., and brainstorming ways to be more efficient and customer-friendly.

A change for us this upcoming year is the re-vamping of our User Fee Schedule. We've moved from a boat and per person launch fee strategy to a flat rate strategy, removed Out-of-County pricing, and added Annual Permits for non-motorized vessels and bank fishing. User fees rose slightly to keep this change from creating a loss of revenue. This is only the second fee increase in more than 12 years.

January Lake Highlights

- Steve completed the IT-mandated KnowBe4 training on "How to protect oneself from mischievous people who try to steal passwords so they can hack into the City computer system and create all kinds of malevolent disturbances".

- Met with Tel and Travis to discuss the placement of a concrete pad for a future building.
- The lake will re-open for the season on Friday, February 4th. We will be open Friday through Sunday throughout the month.

Programming:

- Winter 2021 - 2022 Athletic Programs:
 - Youth Basketball – Youth Basketball season is still underway. Currently we have games going on Monday – Saturday every week in January:
 - Each game consists of 8 - minute quarters (except for the 5U age group in which quarters are 6 minutes).
 - Age groups 8U and Up all require and utilize officials (2 each game)
 - We utilize David Moore (basketball officials assignor) to secure officials for games.
 - A new rule has been implemented this year in order to speed up the games and allow for more actual playing time.
 - The new rule involves awarding 1 point and the ball on all shooting fouls.
 - Free throws are not shot until the final minute of the 4th quarter.
 - The following partnerships are used for games. (5U, 8U & 10U are all handled in house):
 - 6U – Partners with Gibsonville Parks and Recreation. Staff or coaches act as officials for this age group. Games consist of four 8 – minute quarters.
 - 8U Girls – Partners with Alamance County teams. Paid officials are used for this age group. Games consist of four 8 – minute quarters.

- 10U Girls - Partners with Alamance County teams. Paid officials are used for this age group. Games consist of four 8 – minute quarters.
- 12U Boys – Partners with Burlington and Gibsonville Parks and Recreation. Paid officials are used for this age group. Games consist of four 8 – minute quarters.
- 13U Girls – Partners with Alamance County, Burlington, Gibsonville and Mebane Parks and Recreation. Paid officials are used for this age group. Games consist of four 8 – minute quarters.
- Other Information:
 - Playoffs will begin the first week of February.
 - There will be a running clock for all age groups.
 - Games held in Graham will be at the Graham Recreation Center only. Do to staffing issues we will not utilize Ray Street gym for games.
- Upcoming Athletic Programs:
 - Registration is open for Spring Soccer, Lacrosse & Baseball.
 - Practice information for Spring sports will be sent out the second week of February.

Safety Measures:

- For COVID safety measures, guidelines from NCDHHS will be given to parents of participants.
- Parents must also read and sign off on the Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19 upon registering their child for any athletic program. - All individuals entering the Graham Recreation Center and/or Ray Street Academy are asked to wear masks. Active participants, such as coaches and players, will not be required to wear masks when on the court.
- During games, players on the bench will be required to wear a mask but may remove them when they are subbed into the game.
- All coaches have been asked to complete a background check before being able to coach in any sport with the City of Graham.

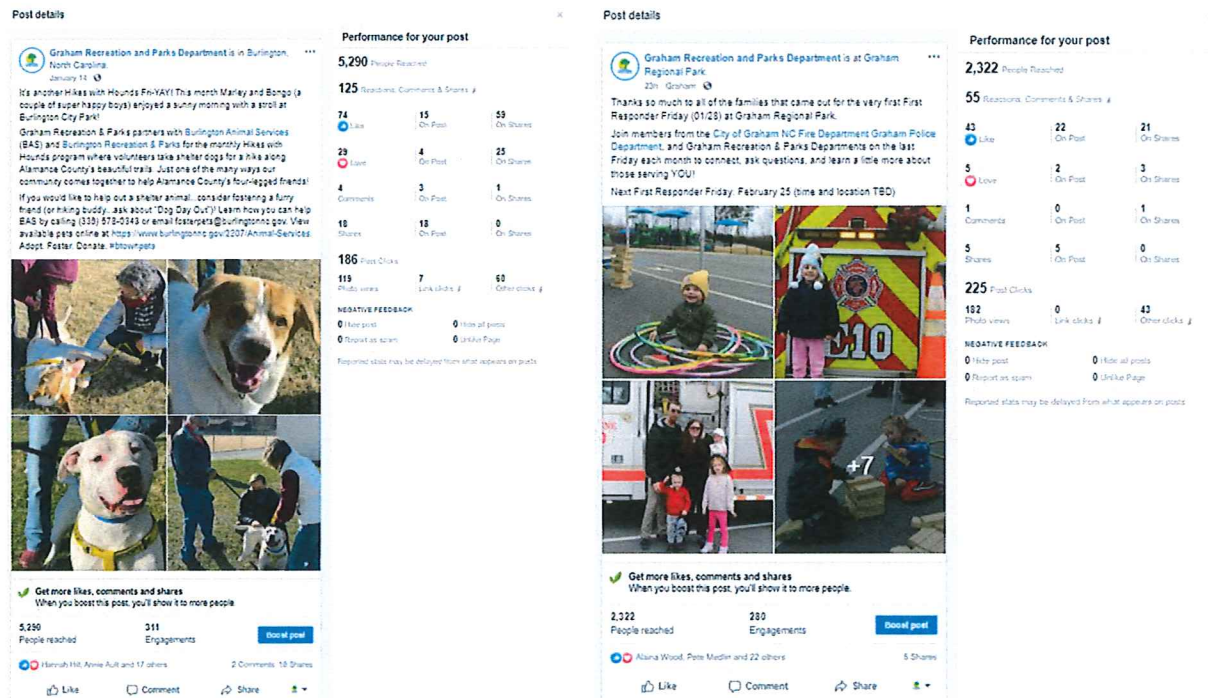
