GRAHAM RECREATION AND PARKS COMMISSION May 11, 2022 GRAHAM HISTORICAL MUSEUM

MINUTES

PRESENT: Chair Jay Cook, Brian Cutlip, Laurie Pickard, Nicki Smith, Tim Beshel

STAFF: Brian Faucette

Chair Cook called the meeting to order at 6:30 with a welcome.

MINUTES

-Mr. Cutlip made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 13, 2022 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Beshel and unanimously approved.

CHAIR'S REPORT

- -Chair Cook reported the Friends of Graham Recreation will meet on May 20th.
- -Chair Cook reported the Sports Hall of Fame Committee recently evaluated the April '22 induction ceremony and that John Harrington will be off the Board for at least one year but would like to be reappointed in 2023. New members will be KJ Stone and Jane Albright. Kim Davis will be the new Chair.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- -Mr. Faucette updated the staff's total training hours of 61.75 with 20.5 of those being classified as DEI training sessions. Additional training hours from the recent Therapeutic Recreation Conference will added.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the Public Works Department has finished grading the area and presented examples and a quote of ~\$92,000 for the materials to replace the shelter at Cooke Park. A contractor will be sought with the hopes of replacing the shelter later in the year.
- -Mr. Faucette informed the Commission that Alley, Williams, Carmen and King have completed surveying a "centerline" for the entrance to the multi-purpose field area at Graham Regional Park. The Public Works Dept. will begin initial grading of the entrance as their schedule allows.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the HVAC screen for the 200 North Park is scheduled to be installed in May.
- -Mr. Faucette reported a walking path is being installed at Graham Regional Park to connect to the new housing development being built across Jim Minor Rd.

OLD BUSINESS

- -Mr. Faucette reported the department has been able to fill part-time positions in Summer Camp and the Parks and Lake Divisions. Positions in the Centers Division remain unfilled. These staffing shortages in the Centers Division will likely result in shortened hours of operation at the Rec. Center.
- -Mr. Faucette reported no new data has been presented for the Graham-Mebane Lake Master Plan.
- -Mrs. Pickard reported she was able to speak with three community members at the listening Session at the Arbor Day Event. -1. Concerns about indoor and outdoor Pickle Ball courts; 2. An Appearance Commission member is still waiting on her "rock" at Graham Regional Park; 3. A recent widow has "discovered" Graham Regional Park. Laurie presented her marketing materials for future GRPD events which were well received. The next listening session will be on May 26th at the Thursday at Seven Concert. The Graham Historical Museum Board will also be hosting board members from Preservation Burlington that night.
- -Mr. Faucette updated the Commission on the recently proposed FY '23 budget and encouraged Commission members to urge City Council members to pass the budget as presented as it supports several GRPD projects.
- -Mr. Faucette reminded the Commission that applications for Boards and Commissions are being excepted and the Recreation Commission will have at least two vacancies to fill.
- -Mr. Faucette did not have an update from the Appearance Commission on their proposed park clean-up day but will send an update.

NEW BUSINESS

- Mr. Faucette reminded the Commission to consider officer nominations and elections. Chair Cook asked members for nominations. Members suggested to delay the nominations and vote until the all (or more) Commission vacancies had been filled.
- -Mr. Faucette updated the Commission on two items to be presented to the Friends Group. 1-A request from the Appearance Committee for the Friends Group to accept the monetary donations that may be received for the

I. Present Projects

- a. Shelter #2 @ Cooke Park We are still researching contractors to install the structure.
- **b. Graham-Mebane Lake Master Plan** Several updates were received in the spring and staff met with the firm in late June. A final plan is expected in the fall.
- c. 200 North pocket park The HVAC screen frame was installed in late June. Panels should be installed in July.

II. Future Projects

- a. Multi-purpose Complex @ GRP Public Works has begun clearing and grading a road to the complex.
- b. Cabin at Cooke Park Plans to reimagine/renovate the cabin remain paused.
- **c. Trail to Graham Regional Park** A trail connecting the sidewalk system of the housing development across Jim Minor Rd. from the GRP has begun. Park staff will continue to formalize the trail through the summer/fall.

III. Policies/Manuals

- a. Sponsorship Work on the development of a departmental sponsorship policy is progressing.
- **b.** G/M Lake Operations Manual My review of the manual is nearly complete. Various forms are being collected from the GRPD, HR, etc. for inclusion in the policy.
- IV. Historical Museum Attendance 20-May, 47-June, 25-May concert and meet/greet with Preservation Burlington, 60-Dino Days (downtown event), 40-June Concert

V. Outside Committees

- **a.** Friends of GRPD During the May meeting, two sponsorship programs were discussed as was the use of sponsorship money to supplement the City's budget to complete the gymnasium floor replacement at the Graham Recreation Center.
- **b.** Wellness Collaborative County-wide initiatives to improve access to physical activity were discussed. A speaker will present in August to continue that discussion.

VI. Staffing

- **a. Medical Leave** Vicky Braniff, Center Supervisor, is currently on medical leave. All GRPD staff have stepped in to cover her responsibilities.
- b. Shortage Operations of centers have been altered as a result of Vicky's absence and general staffing shortage.

Programming:

- Spring 2022 Athletic Programs:
 - > Youth Baseball:
 - Playoff Games for 8U, 10U and 12U baseball leagues have begun.
 - Each age group will utilize a single elimination playoff format.
 - Only teams that fall within the top 6 of standings will compete in the playoffs. Teams that fall out of the top 6 will compete in consolation games.
 - > Youth Softball:
 - Playoff games for 8U and 13U softball leagues have begun.
 - o Each age group will utilize a single elimination playoff format.
 - Only teams that fall within the top 8 will compete in the playoffs.
 Teams that fall out of the top 8 will compete in consolation games.
 - ➤ Youth T-Ball:
 - Games for T-Ball have begun.
 - Teams will play 2 games each week.
 - Each team will play 8 games and each game will last 50 minutes.
 - No score is recorded for T-Ball games.
- Other Information:
 - 8U and 10U baseball playoff games will take place at Gibsonville Recreation and Parks facilities.
 - o Based on the standings, only 2 Softball games will be played at Goley St.
 - o Each baseball and softball game will have only one umpire.
 - o Umpires will not be used for T-Ball games. Staff will supervise games instead.
 - Once baseball and softball have ended, Senior Softball will use field 3 every Wednesday.

- Registration for Youth Summer Sports Camps (Basketball and Flag Football) will open on June 1st.
- Registration for Fall Soccer will open on June 1st.

Graham-Mebane Lake Report, June 2022

Graham Recreation and Parks Department



We've had a busy June at the Lake. Our boat launchings and visitation numbers are returning to pre-Covid levels, but 'non-traditional' use is up. The increase in kayaking, our catfish tournaments, events, and vessel rentals have more than made up for any reduction. Those 'new' uses, and our fee increases this year, have combined to give us our first \$10,000 gross revenue month.

Fishing has been fair for bass, but much better for crappie and catfish.

June Lake Highlights

- Family Day at the Lake (June 11th) was a bit underattended with 58 attendees, but we had a great time and the added lake cruise pontoon ride was well-received.
 Next year we'll move back to the first Saturday in June.
- We couldn't have asked for better weather for our June Catfish Tournament (18th). 81 entrants came out to enjoy the light breeze and high 70s temperatures. The largest catfish caught weighed 4.5 pounds.

- Our new offerings of Annual User Permits have been a big success. We've sold 166 permits (motorized boat, non-motorized boat, and bank fishing); our previous best was 129.
- Chris Mundy, of Burlington, won June in the Big Bass Tournament with a 7.09 lb. bass. We have 67
 entrants in the BBT, and 48 of those entrants signed up for the new Second Chance Tournament.
- We rented out a record 125 vessels (kayaks, canoes, and jonboats).
- The Alamance Co. Rescue Unit Dive Team was out five times during the month for boat operation trainings and a sunken vehicle retrieval training.
- A Water Quality Survey was performed on the 28th. An algaecide spraying (to reduce algae that clog the water plant's intake filters) was performed on July 1st.
- The lake level began its summer-time drop, ending down a ½ foot from full pool.




