Our price changes were accepted with little comment, though the change away from a per person fee met with universal approval. The addition of the non-motorized and bank fishing annual permits drew positive remarks also. The Lake returns to its open six days a week schedule on March $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$.

February Lake Highlights

- We held a lake staff meeting on the 1st.
- We switched from a 'swipe' credit card reader to a 'tap' reader customers have been appreciative of this change.
- The Lake remains in hiring mode at least one new lake attendant is needed.
- Twenty-seven Annual User Fee Permits were sold, (plus eight given as prizes in the 2021 Big Bass Tournament).

It is hoped that Second Chance will add a level of excitement/interest to the BBT and provide an opportunity for anglers that are just short of winning a month to compete in a tournament and possibly, the Fish-Off.


