MINUTES

Chair Cook called the meeting to order at 6:34 with a welcome.

MINUTES

-Mrs. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 9, 2022 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Pickard and unanimously approved.

CHAIR'S REPORT

- -Chair Cook introduced new Council Liaison Bonnie Whitaker with everyone giving a brief introduction.
- -Chair Cook reported 200 people attended the recent Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony.
- -Chair Cook reported he has spoken with current commission members Pat Moser and Kent Davis and both members plan to resign at the end of the current year.
- -Chair Cook reported the S. Graham Park basketball court, soccer field and playground have been busy over the past few weeks.
- -Chair Cook reported the track at Goley St. still needs some attention. The specific area is near Zachary Field.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- -Mr. Faucette reported staff continues to attend trainings with a full update to be presented at the next meeting.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the Public Works Department has removed the debris from the Shelter #2 fire at Cooke Park. They will finish grading the area later in the spring.
- -Mr. Faucette informed the Commission that Alley, Williams, Carmen and King are surveying a "centerline" for the entrance to the multi-purpose field area at Graham Regional Park. The survey will be used by the Public Works Dept. for initial grading of the entrance.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the HVAC screen for the 200 North Park is scheduled to be installed in May.

OLD BUSINESS

- -Mr. Faucette reported the department is still in need of part-time staff with some positions having been filled. An increase in pay-rates will be requested for the FY '22-'23 budget.
- -Mr. Faucette presented the updated site plans for the Graham-Mebane Lake Master Plan. A complete plan is expected to be complete by the summer.

NEW BUSINESS

- Mr. Faucette suggested Community Listening Sessions on April 29th at the Arbor Day event or the first Thursday at Seven Concert Series on May 26th. Details for each event will be forwarded as they are finalized.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the FY '22-'23 budget has been submitted to the City Manager.
- -Mr. Faucette reported he was able to present the department's CIP requests to the City Council at a recent budget meeting. Highlighted requests include gym flooring at the Graham Recreation Center, a mini excavator for the Parks Div. and new jon boats and marina renovations at the Lake.
- -Mr. Faucette reminded those commission members whose terms are ending to submit a new application is they are interested in being reappointed.

Graham Recreation and Parks Commission Director's Report for April '22

I. COVID-19 - The GRPD will continue to monitor changing conditions and adjust program and facility plans as necessary but no restrictions are currently in place.

II. Present Projects

- a. Shelter #2 @ Cooke Park The Public Works Department still needs to complete a final grade for the shelter area. We received a quote of ~\$92,000 for a 30'x50' steel shelter. We will now research contractors to install the structure and begin finalizing an installation plan.
- b. Graham-Mebane Lake Master Plan no updates this month.
- c. 200 North pocket park The HVAC screen is scheduled to be installed in May.

III. Future Projects

- **a. Multi-purpose Complex @ GRP** AWCK has marked a center line for the entry road. Public Works will begin clearing and grading a road to the back of the property as their schedule allows.
- b. Cabin at Cooke Park Plans to reimagine/renovate the cabin remain paused.

IV. Policies/Manuals

- a. Sponsorship Work on the development of a departmental sponsorship policy is progressing.
- b. G/M Lake Operations Manual Multiple GRPD staff members are reviewing the manual.
- V. Historical Museum Attendance 52 signed the guest book in April. Three members of Preservation Burlington's Board visited the museum in April. The Museum will host additional board members in May.

- **c. Training** Fulltime staff have completed a total of 61.75 hours of training, 20.5 of those focusing on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

Programming:

- Spring 2021 Athletic Programs:
 - O Baseball, Softball and T-Ball all started in April. Baseball began on April 5th. Softball began on April 7th. T-Ball began on April 10th.
 - ➤ Baseball consist of 5 "groups"; 1 6U, 2 8U, 1 10U, 1 12U/14U. *12U and 14U age groups were combined.
 - ➤ Softball consist of 1 group; 8U/10U. *8U and 10U age groups were combined.
 - > T-Ball consist of 4 teams.
- Upcoming Athletic Programs:
 - Basketball and Football summer camps are being developed. Currently we anticipate the camps lasting 3 days with 2 hour sessions each day. Basketball camp may be located at the Graham Recreation Center. Location for Football is TBD.

Safety Measures:

- For COVID safety measures, guidelines from NCDHHS were given to parents of participants. The following measures have been implemented:
 - o Coaches modify forms of communication to avoid up close face to face communication.
 - Practices were scheduled to allow adequate buffer times between games to allow athletes, coaches and staff to enter and exit with limited interaction.
 - Sharing of equipment has been limited. (In instances in which equipment needed to be shared, disinfectant was used to sanitize gear before use).
 - o Individuals were reminded to bring their own water bottles and to not share those bottles with other participants.

- T-Ball coaches are parent volunteers.




We had a steady, solid (though not spectacular) April. Public Use numbers were similar to last year, but revenue was slightly higher, reflecting the price changes. So at least for April, the pandemic increase has stayed with us.

Annual Permit sales and entries into our Big Bass Tournament are popular again this year. Last year we totaled 127 and 64 respectively; this year we are already at 116 and 59.

Bass and crappie fishing were fair this month - several cool fronts (or cool rains) slowed the catching down just as it was starting to ramp up. Though the bass fishing did provide smiles during the last week of the month.

April Lake Highlights

- We added two more jon boats to our rental fleet this month, giving us a total of 4 jon boats, 3 canoes, and 22 kayaks. We had 68 rentals during the month.
- We had four club tournaments this month three were from out-of-county.
- Robert Riggan, of Burlington, won April in the Big Bass Tournament with a 7.80 lb. largemouth bass.
- Ray Smith, former IT chief for the City of Graham, caught a new lake-record 12.80 lb. Striped Bass Ray Smith with his lake record Hybrid Bass. Hybrid on the 16th. Hybrids were illegally stocked by anglers in years past, do not reproduce, and, due to the lake's small size, compete with largemouth bass for food. So, they're not a fish species we prefer to have or advertise (though that is one fat fish!).



- Water quality surveys started back up for the summer season, with one being performed on the 26th.
- Frequent rains kept the lake at full pool.
