# GRAHAM RECREATION AND PARKS COMMISSION January 11, 2023 GRAHAM HISTORICAL MUSEUM

#### **MINUTES**

PRESENT: Chair Jay Cook, Laurie Pickard, Nicki Smith, Tim Beshel

STAFF: Brian Faucette

Chair Cook called the meeting to order at 6:30 with a welcome.

#### **MINUTES**

-Mrs. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2022 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Beshel and unanimously approved.

#### **CHAIR'S REPORT**

-Chair Cook reported the Friends Group donated \$35,000 to the City of Graham for the renovation of the gym floors at the Graham Recreation Center. The funds used for the project were received from the Bill and Sara Sizemore Family Foundation. To honor the Sizemore Family, the court in Gym #1 at the Recreation Center was named "Sizemore Court".

#### DIRECTOR'S REPORT

-Mr. Faucette presented the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) from the NC Wildlife Resources Commission for the renovation of the boat launch ramps and docks at Graham-Mebane Lake. After a few questions were answered, the Commission advised Mr. Faucette to present the MOA to City Council as presented.

# **OLD BUSINESS**

- -Mr. Faucette informed the Commission the painting and flooring projects at the Graham Recreation Center and the roofing and flooring projects at the Graham Civic Center have been completed and both centers will return to normal operations.
- -Mr. Faucette reported that quotes for new flooring at the Maple St. Center were under \$8,000. This project will be added to the CIP request.
- -Mr. Faucette reported the quote to repair Shelter #1 was \$5,610. This will be given to the insurance company to begin processing a claim.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- -Mr. Faucette informed the Commission that he and City Manager Megan Garner had a discussion concerning future grants for the GRPD. Potential projects include:
  - 1) Purchase of adjacent property to GRPD parks Mr. Faucette will send a letter of interest to the owners of property adjacent to Cooke Park, Graham-Mebane Lake and Graham Regional Park indicating the City's interest in the property to expand recreational opportunities for our community.
  - 2) Multipurpose Fields at Graham Regional Park Mr. Faucette presented updated plans and cost estimates from the City's engineering firm, Alley, Williams, Carmen and King for to the multipurpose fields.
  - 3) Trails Mr. Faucette is beginning to explore a possible partnership with local trail advocates in order to begin design and construction of the perimeter hiking/biking trail at Graham Regional Park.

- a. Shelter #1 @ Cooke Park All insurance claims were processed. Work to repair the shelter began on February 28<sup>th</sup> and is expected to be complete by the end of March.
- **b.** Shelter #2 @ Cooke Park All necessary quotes have been received and an insurance claim has been submitted. It is expected to be signed in early March with work to begin in late spring.

- O Winter Youth Athletics Programs:
  - ➤ Winter 2022-23 Youth Basketball:
    - Playoff games for basketball have begun.
      - Games will take place on Mondays Thursdays for age groups 6U 13U.
         5U and 14U leagues will play games on Fridays & Saturdays.
      - We will work with an outside official's assignor to secure referees for games. All age groups excluding 5U, will utilize officials.
      - 6U, 8U Girls, 10U Girls, 12U Boys, 13U Girls & 14U Boys will all partner with other municipalities to play games during the season.
      - 8U boys and 10U boys will both be coordinated and run completely in house and will consist of only Graham teams.
      - Each night 2 or 3 staff members will man the scorers table. 1 staff member or supervisor will monitor the facility while games occur.
      - Some nights the small gym (auxiliary gym) will be used for practice while the large gym hosts games.

  - Youth Soccer practice will begin in February.
  - All soccer practice will both take place at Bill Cooke Park.

  - As of now we currently have 194 participants registered for soccer.


Graham-Mebane Lake opened our 2023 season on Friday,
