Graham-Mebane Lake Report, March 2023 Graham Recreation and Parks Department



The Lake returned to its six-days-a-week schedule on March 1st. We had a good month, averaging over 17 boats and 45 customers per day. Bass fishing was very good, with many anglers reporting they had a "good day"; though one angler (approx. age 5) had the "best day of his career". Eight trophy-sized bass (over 7 pounds) were weighed-in. Crappie fishing has yet to turn on, though bank fishing is beginning to pick up.

March Lake Highlights

- Brian and Steve met with NC Wildlife engineers on the 7th about the renovation of our boat launch ramps.
- Thirty anglers in 17 boats came out for our Bass Tournament on the 25th. The three winning teams caught over 20 pounds of bass each, with the Big Fish of the day coming in at 7.97 pounds. A 5-fish bag of 25.55 pounds took first place.
- Charles Foust, of Graham, won the month in our Big Bass Tournament with a 9.27-pound bass. We added 29 anglers to the Tournament, raising the total to 42. Eighteen of those 29 entrants also chose to enter our Second Chance Tournament (year total to 30).
- We sold 41 Annual Permits, bringing this year's total to 70.
- A Barred Owl is nesting near the marina building for the third year in a row.
- The lake remained at full pool for the month.
